SCHOOL CHARACTERISTICS

Established in 1994, Christian Heritage Classical School is a K4-12, inter-denominational, college preparatory, independent day school with a rigorous curriculum and a selective admissions process. Christian Heritage values parent involvement and students serving in the community. CHCS is committed to pursuing the discipline of critical thinking, a lifelong love of learning, and an understanding of God's unique calling on the lives of our students. CHCS values the need to cultivate leadership skills so that our students can make a difference in the world.

CURRICULAR DISTINCTIVE

Christian Heritage is a Christian classical school employing the centuries-proven methodology known as the *Trivium* -- Grammar, Logic, and Rhetoric. Students begin studying Latin in 3rd grade. At the high school level, our humanities program focuses on an intensive study of the great writings, people, works, events, and ideas that have formed and reformed civilization as we know it. Emphasis is placed upon reading, writing, speaking, and critical-thinking skills. All students participate in Socratic debates of moral, philosophical, political, and theological nature. A primary goal at Christian Heritage is to develop well-rounded students who are equipped with skills that will enable them to be articulate, discerning, and effective members of their communities.

MATH AND SCIENCE

The math and science curriculum at Christian Heritage provides students a rigorous course of study and the opportunity to complete AP-level coursework during their senior year. We use an inquiry approach and a variety of laboratory experiences to develop problem-solving skills. Our students are prepared for an easy transition to demanding engineering, pre-medical, computer science, and other math and science fields of study in college.

FINE ARTS

Fine Arts is a core discipline at Christian Heritage, giving students the opportunity to study the arts from Grammar School through Rhetoric. The role of the fine arts program is to encourage students to explore, discover, and develop their God-given abilities with excellence in the musical, theatrical, and visual arts in order to glorify their Creator and influence their world for Christ. Students have multiple opportunities to perform throughout the year.

ACCREDITATION

Christian Heritage Classical School is accredited through Cognia(formerly AdvanceED).

SENIOR THESIS

The writing of a Senior Thesis is the culmination of the entire Christian, classical educational experience. The student will investigate and offer solutions to a contemporary problem of national, global, or eternal significance. Through multidisciplinary research, persuasive argument, and a Christian worldview, the student will write a 20-page research paper, present for 30 minutes, and defend his or her thesis for 15 minutes in front of a live audience at the end of his or her senior year.

GPA COMPUTATION

Grades are calculated on a 4.0 scale. Transcript grades are not weighted. Weighting is used only for the determination of valedictorian and salutatorian after the first semester of the senior year. AP and Honors courses are designated on the transcript.
