

Dear Rising Seventh Grader and Parent,

Our summer reading continues the Narnia series as we read *The Silver Chair* by C.S. Lewis. I enjoy teaching this novel because, in some aspects, this story is a reflection of C.S. Lewis' journey to Christianity. We join a transformed Eustace, his classmate Jill Pole, and the Marshwiggle Puddleglum as they search for Caspian's son Rilian, the heir to the Narnian throne.

Students should read the novel before school begins. We will spend a little time at the beginning of the school year discussing the book and will have an assessment.

In the past, the students and I read this book during the school year and discussed the elements of this narrative in class. Since we are reading this during the summer, I have a series of Google classroom "lectures" (most of these will each be five minutes or less) and a reading check over each chapter. **These are required.** I am working on these lectures and reading checks and will add them to our Google classroom by mid-June. In addition, students should complete the shark-fin plot diagram.

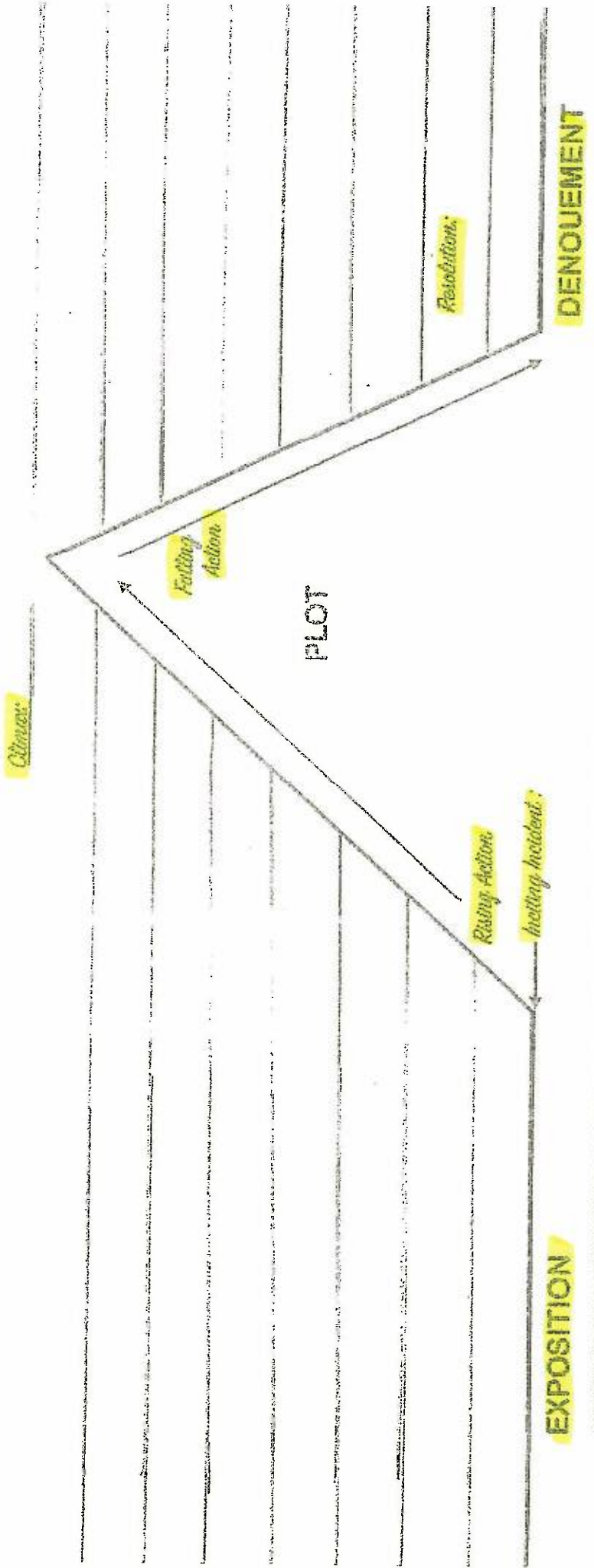
